

5 WAYS TO MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR VISIT TO SWAN HILL



How to get there

From Melbourne:

By car: The drive is approximately 340 km and takes about 3.5 to 4 hours. Take the Calder Freeway (M79) north, then continue onto the Murray Valley Highway (B400).
By train: V/Line from Suthern Cross Station to Swan Hill. The journey takes about 4 hours and 20 minutes.

From Adelaide:

By car: The drive is about 580 km and takes approximately 6 to 6.5 hours. Take the South Eastern Freeway (M1), then the Dukes Highway (A8), followed by the Mallee Highway (B12).

From Sydney:

By car: The drive is about 870 km and takes approximately 9 to 10 hours. Take the Hume Highway (M31) towards Melbourne, then the Newell Highway (A39) towards Finley, and finally the Murray Valley Highway (B400) to Swan Hill.
